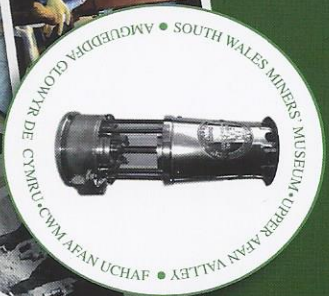
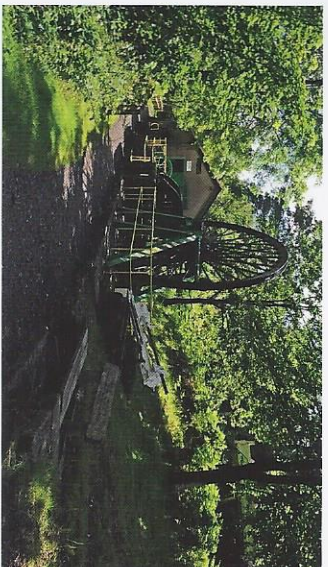

The South Wales Miners' Museum is the oldest museum in Wales. Since 1976, our volunteer run museum has won awards for accessibility, interpretation and its dedication to preserve the social history of coal mining in the Afan and Llynfi valley.

Our Volunteers are trained to provide guided tours of the museum, many of which are former coal miners with plenty of local knowledge and personal experience of life in the mines and of the communities that they once grew up in.

The museum's outdoor exhibits include a re-created Black Smith's shop, a lamp room, and a haulage house. The museum is also home to the scale working steam locomotive – 'Glyndwr.'
