



# Great shows on your doorstep



Are you a community group in Wales that would like to put on a professional show in your local area?

Night Out helps to take away the headache of financial risk. It is simple and easy to use, providing funding and tickets, together with practical help and advice. The website includes shows and recommendations on a huge variety of performances for all ages, from theatre and music to dance and puppetry.

## How it works – simplified:

- Get in touch with the performer and pencil in a date.
- Apply to Night Out through the website [www.nightout.org.uk](http://www.nightout.org.uk), applying at least four weeks before the event but preferably much earlier.
- Night Out will pay the performer fee and you get the show at a reduced rate which in some cases can be guaranteed by your Local Authority thus taking away all or most of the financial risk.
- Promote the event, market it to your local community, have a great time. Afterwards, report back and pay back the ticket income (up to a maximum of the performer fee).
