# **Current Projects**

At present the club has a few projects underway. These are:

#### 1. Hay on Wye

This is a 32 foot long end to end layout based on Hay on Wye station. The layout is in OO scale and will be a "clubroom" layout that will be used for "running evenings", open days etc. The layout is fairly well advanced with some scenic work still needing to be completed.

#### 2. Pendinam

This is an O gauge layout which we hope will be an exhibition standard layout.

The layout is a 28 ft long end to end layout based on a fictional location in Mid Wales where the LNWR and GWR met "end to end". The lines were developed to take advantage of local industry including a stone quarry, timber sawmill and dairy.

Work on track laying and electrics is completed and scenic work is well underway.

The layout is fitted with a DC controller and DCC-EX command station, so both DC and DCC fitted locomotives can be run.

If you are interested in O gauge modelling we would be very happy to welcome you to our group.

## **Current Projects cont.**

#### 3. Four Wells

This is a substantial oval shaped layout in OO gauge which features a main line station, goods shed and motive power depot with turntable. The layout also has a branch line which leads to a high level terminus station. The layout is progressing well, but a substantial amount of scenic upgrading needs to be done to complete the layout.

#### 4. N Gauge Layout

Work has recently started on a new, as yet unnamed, "N Gauge" layout based on American practice. The new baseboards have been constructed and work to create the track beds is well advanced with track laying expected to begin shortly.

If you are interested in N Gauge then you would be very welcome to join our new group.

We have also been lucky enough to have a large quantity of "garden railway" trackwork donated to the club, so that is another layout we could be developing in the coming months.
